What is the Visiting & Buddy Service and What does it offer you?

Among the biggest challenges facing those who are bereaved, particularly in later years, are loneliness and isolation.

In recognition of this, Bereavement Matters offers you a valuable and unique service called the Visiting & Buddy Service designed to help bereaved adults.

Our Visiting Service aims to provide bereaved adults *of any age* essential listening support to help you cope with the challenges of bereavement.

Our Buddy Service aims to help bereaved adults *over 55 years old* to broaden their social horizons and build new friendships by attending one of the many clubs or groups that exist in the area for their age group.

Confidentiality

Confidentiality will be respected except in circumstances where there is danger to self and/or to others.

In accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998, all information is securely held by SABN and treated confidentially and with respect. It will be held solely for the purpose of providing support for bereaved persons. The information will not be disclosed to external agents without the express permission of the individual concerned, other than to comply with statutory or other legal requirements. To ensure that information that we hold is accurate and up-to-date, you should inform SABN of any changes. Information may be used for SABN's own promotional purposes which include our newsletter, information on our activities and fundraising. This may be done by telephone, email or post. If you do not wish your information to be used in this way, or you do not wish to be contacted by electronic means, please inform us.



We offer:

- An initial assessment with a qualified counsellor to give you the opportunity to discuss the support you may need. There is a charge of £30 for this one-off assessment or £15 for those on means-tested benefits.
- If the Visiting Service is felt to be beneficial, a designated volunteer will contact you to arrange a series of regular sessions which can take place at your home or in our premises in central St Albans.
- If and/or when you are interested in broadening your social horizons, we can provide information about the many groups for the over 55s in the St Albans district such as:
 - hobby/special interests clubs
 - sports and other activities such as quiz and scrabble
 - spiritual groups including church and other faith groups
 - lunchtime clubs
- We will meet with you to discuss what your needs and interests are and what day/time would be best for you and accompany you on your first two visits.
- We will follow-up with you after you have attended the group/club for a few weeks.

Your Support Worker

- Is a trained Bereavement Matters volunteer who abides by our Code of Ethics and Practice and receives regular supervision support.



Other Services

If the Visiting & Buddy Service does not seem right for you at the moment, we also offer:

- One-to-one weekly counselling
- Telephone Support
- Helpline ~ 9am-1pm Monday to Thursday (answerphone available out of hours)
- Children & Young People's Service
- Information & resources on bereavement
